Colorado Life Trak saves lives...

- Within minutes, rather than hours, days, or longer, significantly reducing the risk of harm or death to the patient;
- At night as well as during the day, and in all weather conditions;
- ♣ In both populated and extremely remote or thickly vegetated areas;
- Inside buildings, cars, or other objects, and under bridges, vegetation, or other cover;
- ♣ Whether the transmitter wearer is cooperative, conscious, hiding, or even aware that he is missing;
- Independently of any passerby or Good Samaritan

The Colorado Life Trak system costs each law enforcement agency between \$6,000 - \$10,000 to implement — approximately the same cost as just one 4-6 hour search for a missing person <u>not</u> wearing the radio wristband transmitter.

The replacement costs are: \$275 for the transmitter unit; \$53 for the transmitter tester; \$10 for the battery. Tax deductible donations are welcomed and appreciated.

Program Particulars

- Colorado Life Trak is an additional tool to help locate lost or missing persons.
- Colorado Life Trak can help provide peace of mind to caregivers. However, it does not replace the need for supervised care.
- Tax deductible donations are welcomed and appreciated to defray the cost of equipment: \$275 transmitter unit; \$53 transmitter tester; \$10 battery.



How it Works!

Family members or caregivers may contact the Mesa County Sheriff's Office to begin the Colorado Life Trak application process. A Sheriff's Office member will be available to assist in completing the application and review the contract and program guidelines with the applicant and their family or caregiver. Once selected for the program, a radio transmitter will be placed on the participant's wrist.

If the participant becomes lost or missing, the Sheriff's Office has specialized tracking equipment to help isolate the location of the transmitter the participant is wearing. The search will start from the last known location of the participant and work outward until the transmission signal is obtained. The goal is to determine the location of the signal in a quick, timely manner, minimizing the risk of harm to the loved one.

The Transmitter!



The transmitter is a small circular radio device on a wristband, approximately the size of a wristwatch. The transmitters and wristbands are worn 24 hours a day, 7 days a week and are difficult to remove without the appropriate tools.

Caregivers will be required to test the transmitter daily by passing it over a small tester in the home. A Sheriff's Office member or representative will visit the participant's home monthly to change the wristband and battery as well as document any significant changes in behavior or personality that may affect a law enforcement search effort.
